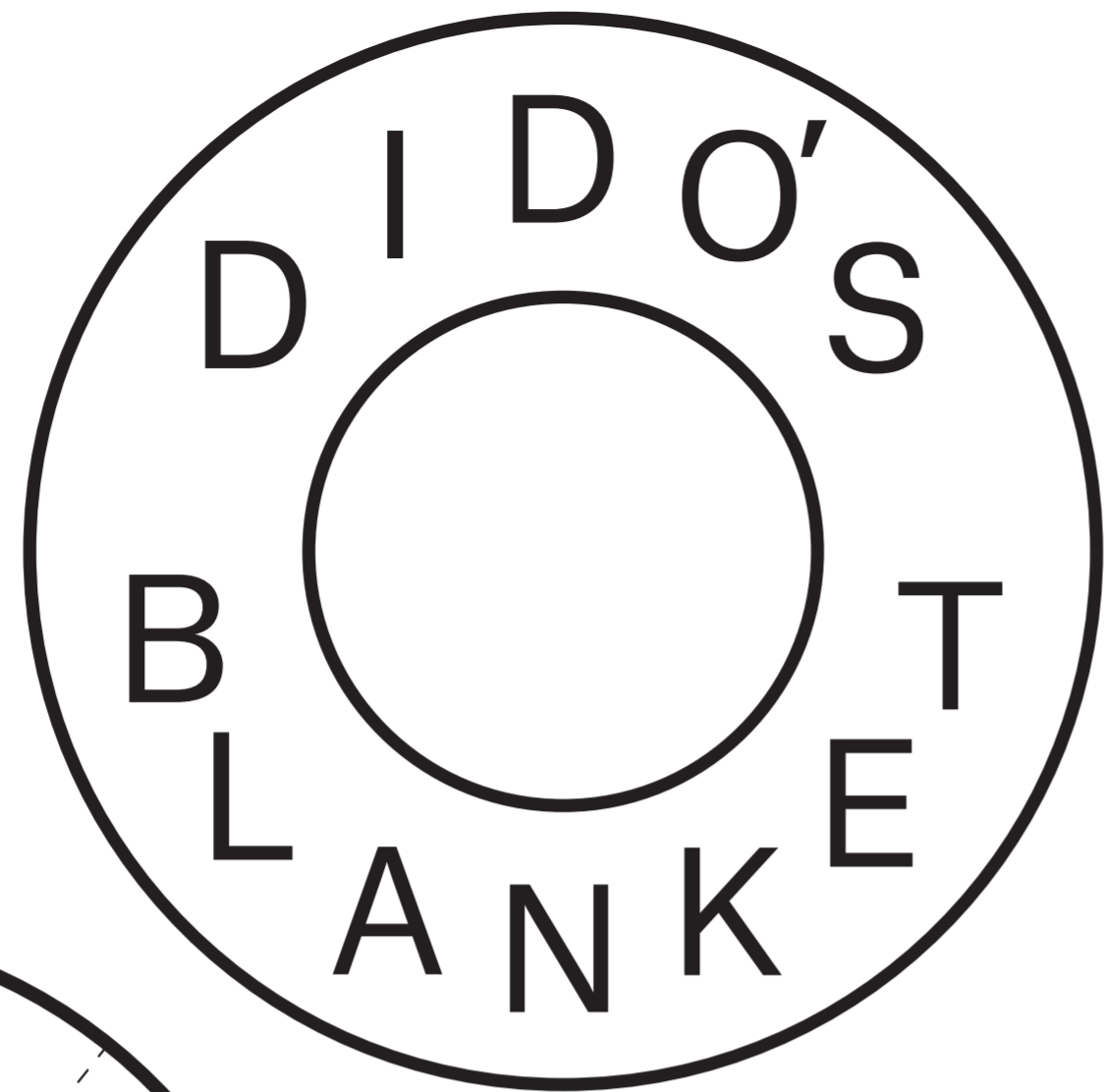

Creating architecture by enclosing the common area

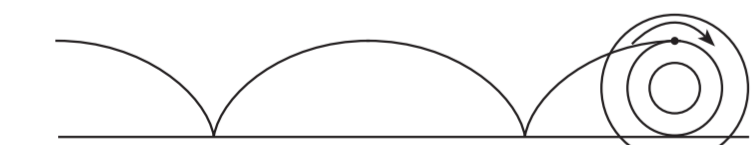
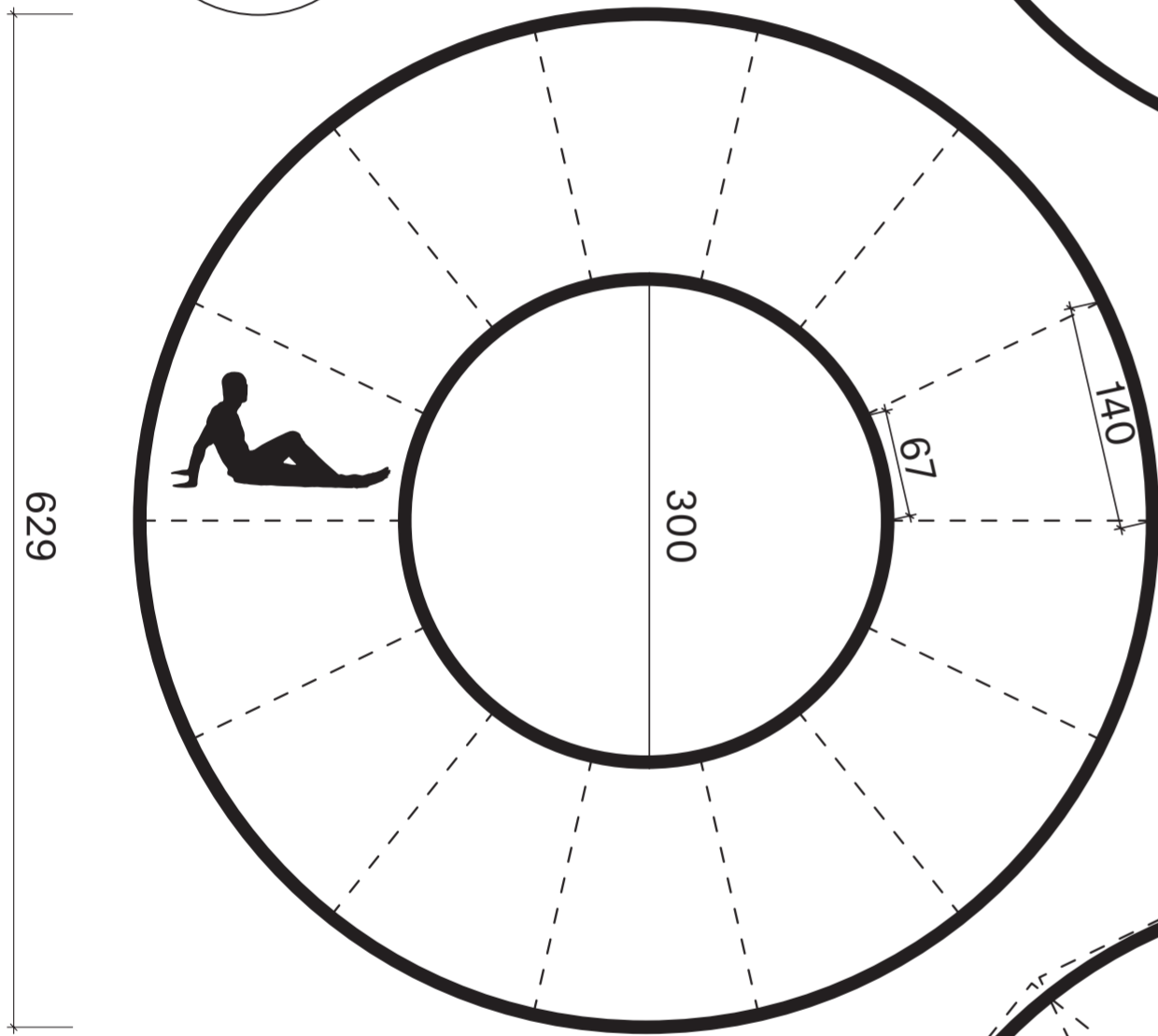
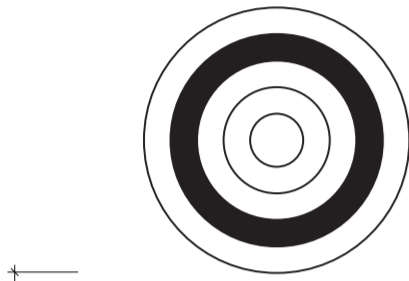

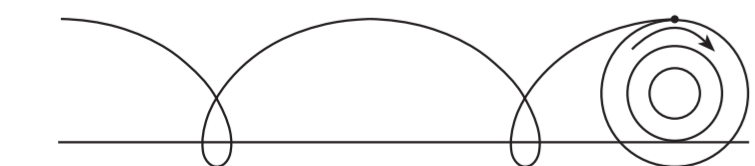

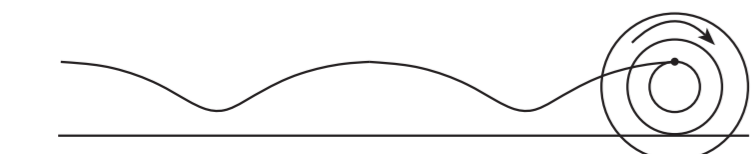

A cycloid generated by a point outside the rolling circle.
